Consultancy Service for conducting Project Impact Evaluation for Climate Resilience Improvement Project Procurement No: CRIP/CS/QCBS/64

The Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka has received a credit from the International Development Association (IDA) to implement the Climate Resilience Improvement Project (CRIP) in 18 districts of the country during six-year period from August 2014 to 31st December 2020. Project Management Unit (PMU) of the project intends to utilize part of credits to obtain Consultancy Service for conducting Project Impact Evaluation (PIE) for Climate Resilience Improvement Project.

The Project Management Unit of the CRIP on behalf of the Ministry Procurement Committee (MPC) now invites qualified consultancy firms to indicate interest in providing the services to carry out above assignment.

The objectives of the PIE are to estimate impact of project intervention and to evaluate the post-project qualitative and quantitative changes of the project components. In this respect, changes in flood and drought risk to people and properties in the target population in terms of impact of floods, droughts and landslides due to climate change, additional protection given for agricultural crops and production, benefits gain from improved infrastructures for irrigated agriculture, transport continuity, education continuity, access to markets and services and people connectivity, intervention on skills development of officers in implementing agencies, capacity building of work environment, knowledge gained on future flood and drought risk modelling and flood and drought risk assessment and management, internalization of flood and drought risk management in future development planning, and new technology and knowledge gain, acquire, process and share with stakeholders, information archive for further research and development etc. are considered for main impact variables and detailed objective are given below.

Consultancy firms are required to provide information on experience of conducting project impact evaluation/assessment under donor funded projects in similar capacity and context and to submit following details to justify that, firm is qualified to perform this consultancy service.

A. Qualifications expected from the firm;

- A 1. A firm actively involved in the related field for last 7 years on socio-economic surveys, baseline surveys, project impact evaluation and project outcome surveys
- A 2. Previous involvements in conducting project impact evaluation/assessment for GoSL and/or foreign funded projects
- A 3. Availability of technical experts in the field of monitoring and evaluation.

B. The firm should submit the following documents in order to justify the requested qualifications;

- B 1. Company Profile including date of incorporation
- B 2. Staff strength including technical, management and supporting (include short CVs of key staff)
- B 3. Details of projects above Rs. 6 million undertaken by the firm during last 7-year period
- B 4. Details of projects similar to this assignment undertaken by the firm during the last five years
- B 5. Details of experience on conducting project impact evaluation / outcome surveys in the field of climate resilience
- B 6. Statements to show the financial strengths of the company for last 5 years (attached audited accounts as proofs)

The interested firm should provide necessary details/information as requested above with 01 original and 05 copies for shortlisting purpose along with the EOI.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to paragraph 1.9 of the World Bank's Guidelines: Selection and Employment of Consultants by World Bank Borrowers - January 2011, setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest. The Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Quality & Cost Based Selection Method (QCBS) set out in the Consultant Guidelines.

Consultants may associate with other firms in the form of a joint venture or a sub-consultancy to enhance their qualifications.

The consultancy is expected to be completed within three (03) months.
